- ❑ RHODE ISLAND NO SMOKING – Poster must be displayed where smoking is prohibited. (#39700 EN, #39701 SP)
- ❑ RHODE ISLAND TEMPORARY EMPLOYEE PROTECTION ACT – Poster must be displayed by all temporary service agencies. (#39702)
- ❑ RHODE ISLAND SICK AND SAFE LEAVE – Optional poster that includes information on the Healthy and Safe Families and Workplace Act. (#39704)
- ❑ BLOODBORNE PATHOGEN POSTER – Protect employees who are exposed to blood or other potentially infectious materials, including HIV, HBV, and HCV viruses. (#74203)
- ❑ HAZARD IDENTIFICATION POSTER – The familiar “diamond” color coding system can be used to identify hazardous chemicals in the workplace and the appropriate personal protective equipment. (#74603)
- ❑ OSHA HAZARD COMMUNICATION STANDARD POSTER – Train employees to read chemical labels and recognize OSHA’s hazardous chemical pictograms. (#74632 EN, #75632 SP)
